Collective Bargaining Agreement covering the Authority's Blue Collar employees for a five-year term period from April 1, 2003 through March 31, 2008; and

**WHEREAS,** By resolution identified as Item No. 40 of the Minutes of the Meeting of December 28, 2006, the Authority adopted certain negotiated wage increments and entered into a Collective Bargaining Agreement covering the Authority's White Collar employees for a three-year term period from April 1, 2006 through March 31, 2008; and

**WHEREAS,** The Authority deems it advisable to provide for all Managerial/ Confidential" employees that are not covered under separate contract a 2.0 % salary increase for the term of one year;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Authority is hereby directed to provide the abovementioned 2.0 % wage increase for all "Managerial/Confidential" employees that are not covered under separate contract effective April 1, 2007.
