TO RENDER CONSULTING ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE INSPECTION, CLEANING AND DISINFECTION OF SEVERAL WATER STORAGE TANKS, IDENTIFIED AS CONTRACT NO. WHEREAS, The RFP process was conducted pursuant to the enacted state legislation (New York State Finance Law §§139-j and 139-k) and the Authority's Purchasing Guidelines, Policies and Procedures; and

WHEREAS, Upon evaluating the response to the RFP, the Authority deems it advisable to have O'Brien & Gere Engineers, Inc. render professional consulting engineering services for the inspection, cleaning and disinfection of several water storage tanks, identified as Contract No. OBG-009; and

WHEREAS, Wesley C. Dust, Executive Engineer and Robert A. Mendez, Executive Director recommend that the Authority enter into an agreement with O'Brien & Gere Engineers, Inc. for a total estimated cost of \$198,000;

WHEREAS, It has been suggested to the Authority that end of the calendar year renewal pricing may not be as favorable as mid-year pricing due to the inability of underwriters to pay the proper attention to the risk presented at the end of the year due to the sheer volume of accounts being renewed at this time; and

WHEREAS, Robert J. Lichtenthal, Jr., Deputy Director, advises that Liberty Mutual (Property Coverage) has offered a twelve month extension of coverage at the same rate as the expiring policy; and

WHEREAS, Robert J. Lichtenthal, Jr., Deputy Director and Robert A. Mendez, Executive Director recommend accepting the above offers to extend the Property coverage for twelve months;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Niederpruem, Sr. Production Engineer have reviewed the specifications and bids and determined that Gehring Pumps, Inc. is the lowest bidder qualified to perform the project and have recommended that a contract be awarded to that firm for the abovementioned project; and

WHEREAS, Jay Meyers, Production Engineer will be the designated contact person for the project with the adoption of this resolution;

ITEM 8 - APPROVAL OF AMENDMENT NO. 1 OF MALCOLM PIRNIE, INC. TO PROVIDE THE ERIE COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY WITH A VAN DE WATER TREATMENT PLANT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN, IDENTIFIED AS CONTRACT NO. MP-75, PROJECT NO. 200800096 - \$95,000.00

WHEREAS, Heretofore and on the 29th day of May, 2008, the Erie County Water Authority (Authority) entered into an agreement with Malcolm Pirnie, Inc. for Van de Water Treatment Plant Capital Improvement Plan, identified as Contract No. MP-75; and

WHEREAS, Said consultant has submitted Amendment No. 1 in the sum of \$95,000.00 to provide for the following changes:

ADD: Engineering Services for evaluating the existing Texas and Lang Avenue interconnection with the City of Buffalo, the rehabilitation/improvements at Pine Hill Pump Station and Vukelic Pump Station, and cross-connection control at Van De Water Treatment Plant.

DELETE: Immersed Membrane Evaluation; and

WHEREAS, The reason for the above changes is as follows:

The interconnection with the City of Buffalo has the potential to supplement the ECWA system during emergencies and periods of high demand. This may allow the Authority to postpone the expansion of Van de Water Treatment Plant to provide additional capacity. The cross-connection control evaluation was recommended to the Authority by the Erie County Health Department during a walk-through of the Van de Water Treatment Plant by Health Department staff. An immersed membrane system is not a feasible alternative for the Van de Water Treatment Plant; and

WHEREAS, Wesley C. Dust, P.E., Executive Engineer and Robert A. Mendez, Executive Director recommend approval of said Amendment No. 1;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That Amendment No. 1 of Malcolm Pirnie, Inc. in the amount of \$95,000 to provide for the abovementioned change be approved; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Chairman be and he hereby is authorized to execute said Amendment No. 1 on behalf of the Authority.
