WHEREAS, The bid bonds have all been approved by Anthony Alessi, Claims Representative/Risk Manager; and

WHEREAS, Robert Brown, Director of Equal Employment Opportunity, has advised that the low bidder, O'Connell Electric Co., Inc. has complied with the Authority's Affirmative Action Requirements and recommends that they be allowed to proceed with their contract based on that fact; and

WHEREAS, Wesley C. Dust, P.E., Executive Engineer and Robert A. Niederpruem, Sr. Production Engineer have reviewed the specifications and bids and determined that O'Connell Electric Co., Inc. is the lowest bidder qualified to perform the project and have recommended that a contract be awarded to that firm for the abovementioned project; and

WHEREAS, Robert A. Mendez, Executive Director concurs with said recommendation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That it is hereby determined that O'Connell Electric Co., Inc. is the lowest responsible bidder for the abovementioned project, and that the Chairman be and he hereby is authorized and directed to execute a contract with said contractor for the high voltage, service, switchgear inspection and emergency electrical work within the Erie County Water Authority's facilities for a period of two years from June 1, 2010 through May 31, 2012 in the total amount of \$1,155,260.00; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Director of Administration is hereby authorized and directed to create a Master Purchase Order for the abovementioned contract.

WHEREAS, The Finance Committee shall meet at such times as deemed advisable by the chair, but not less than twice a year and shall meet prior to any debt issuance planned to be undertaken by the Authority; and

WHEREAS, Mark J. Fuzak, Counsel and Robert A. Mendez, Executive Director recommends adopting a Finance Committee Charter and appointment of the committee pursuant to PAL Section 2824 (8);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Authority hereby adopts a Finance Committee Charter and appoints a committee consisting of the Three members of the Board of Commissioners and Frank E. Swiatek as Chairman of the committee, pursuant to Section 2824 (8) of the Public Authorities Law.
