WHEREAS, The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of ten (10) years from the date hereof and for successive ten-year periods thereafter unless a notice of intent to renegotiate or terminate said Agreement is given by one party to the other within one year prior to the expiration of one of the ten-year periods; and

WHEREAS, Edward A. Betz, Associate Counsel has reviewed said Agreement and recommends entering into the Agreement with the Town; and

WHEREAS, Wesley C. Dust, Executive Engineer and Robert A. Mendez, Executive Director concur with said recommendation;

WHEREAS, The Authority advised the Village that additional infrastructure improvements beyond the Village Improvements are needed to bring said water system into compliance with Authority's standards; and

WHEREAS, The Village has submitted a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") outlining the intent of the proposed project and responsibilities of both Authority and the Village; and

WHEREAS, Under the date of March 25, 2013, the Village, by resolution, authorized execution of the MOU with the Authority;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Chairman be and he hereby is authorized to execute said MOU with the Village; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the Secretary be and he hereby is authorized to forward an executed copy of said MOU together with a certified copy of this resolution to the Village.
