**QUARTERLY DBP ANALYSIS: URGENT SAMPLING** 

REQUIRED

Disinfection By-Product (DBP) Sampling and Analysis is required by SDWIS to be performed quarterly, within a given time frame of each quarter. Any sampling not completed within the required time frame is a violation by the state. Also, all compliance tests MUST be completed by a New York State ELAP certified laboratory, otherwise, another state violation will result.

Our contract laboratory, Pace Analytical, received our last set of quarterly samples on December 6, 2018 (this set was a resampled set due to a previous error on their part). Pace notified me yesterday, late afternoon, that due to their equipment failure they took it upon themselves to forward ECWA's samples to their contract laboratory, BSK, in California. BSK of California is NOT NYS ELAP certified to perform DBP analysis. The results will not be accepted by the state.

Therefore, we need to resample our DBP sites, and submit them for analysis by the end of the month. Eric County Public Health Laboratory (ECPHL) is certified by NYS and is able to accept our samples next week at a cost of \$100.00/ sample for 21 samples. This is \$11.00 greater than the contracted price with Pace Analytical. Please refer to purchase order #SB18-00021.
